Peter Fonagy, Ph.D., FBA, is the Freud Memorial Professor of Psychoanalysis and head of the Research Department of Clinical, Educational and Health Psychology at University College London and chief executive of the Anna Freud Centre, London. He holds a visiting position at the Child Study Centre at Yale University. He is a Fellow of the British Academy and currently chairs the Research Board of the International Psychoanalytic Association. His work integrates empirical research with psychoanalytic theory, and his clinical interests' center around borderline psychopathology, violence and early attachment relationships. He has published more than 500 peer-reviewed articles and chapters and has authored or edited 27 books, including *Mentalizing in Clinical Practice, Social Cognition and Developmental Psychopathology* and the forthcoming *Handbook of Mentalizing in Clinical Practice*. He serves on the editorial boards of *the International Journal of Psychoanalysis, Psychological Issues,* and *Bulletin of The Menninger Clinic*.

Learning Purpose/Goal

This lecture will look at the techniques associated with mentalization based treatment approach for group psychotherapy. It will focus on the aims of group therapy as well as the specific techniques and processes used by MBT group therapists to enhance mentalizing in a range of patient groups. We will cover the introduction to mentalizing groups (MBT – I) which is a structured approach taken usually before initiating individual and group therapy using an MBT approach. We will discuss specific alternative structures which developers of MBT have adopted in relation to group therapy including the structured approach developed in Norway and the more psychodynamic approach taken by colleagues in the Netherlands. The lecture will include a demonstration of recordings of group therapy taken as part of the trial of MBT for antisocial personality disorder currently ongoing in UK probation services.

- 3. Participants will be able to recognize, and practice simple techniques developed by structural group therapists using MBT.
- 4. Participants will develop an appreciation of the difference between MBT and other dynamic approaches to group psychotherapy.
