Mental health falls under a broad umbrella that affects every part of an individual's life. It connects to a person's emotional, psychological, and social well-being. Childhood experiences, trauma, and social environments can all have lasting impacts on mental health. Lifestyle factors such as sleep, diet, exercise, and substance use also play an important role. In addition, brain chemistry imbalances and neurotransmitter levels can contribute to mental health challenges.

The mental health umbrella covers a range of conditions, including anxiety, mood disorders, depression, and other mental illnesses. Mental illness does not discriminate—age, race, gender, or culture can all be affected. These struggles can impact not only the individual but also their family and community, often leading to negative outcomes if left unaddressed.

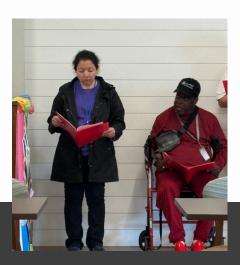
